

The first Dine Around for 2016 was a success. Several SLO Skiers showed up at the Pizza Republic for good food, friends and fun!












## **FUN, FUN, FUN...IN PARK CITY**

Here is a schedule of activities for all skiers and non-skiers to enjoy.

## **Sunday – March 20, 2016**

### Main Street Walking Tour & Guided Museum Tour

Start out with a guided tour of the museum which is housed, in part, inside the historic City Hall which was built in 1885 and houses many artifacts from Park City's colorful past. Then...put on your walking shoes and explore Park City's Historic Main Street. Explore the architecture and stories of Park City's unique history. There is no cost to members for the tours. Meet at the Museum, a 3 minute



walk from the condominiums, at 11:00 am for this 2 hour tour. No host lunch to follow.

### Monday - March 21, 2016 Guided Snowmobile Trip

This three hour custom trip will get you farther into the Backcountry up to 11,000ft. We stop at a Lookout Cabin for a quick deli lunch, take a break and enjoy the 9,000ft views. Options include snow gear (boots and suits) for \$10 and collision insurance

## Tuesday – March 22, 2016 Park City Food Tour

A cultural and historical tour with a culinary twist. As we make our way down Main Street we will stop into several restaurants for a taste of their cuisine paired with a specially selected wine. We also stop at specialty shops which are meant to entertain, with no purchase required. There is enough food that



most will be full after the tour. This tour starts **at 3:15p.m.**, and is within a 3 minute walk from the condominiums, so skiers you may want to join in on this tasty tour. Cost \$45 per person.

\$18 and rentals for \$16 per day. Group lessons are offered at 9:15a.m. and 1:15p.m. daily. The course is approximately I mile from our accommodations which can be reached by local transit.

### **IN MEMORIUM**

DAN NAGLE, a life time member of the SLO Skiers passed away January 20<sup>th</sup> from complications due to Alzheimer's Disease. In rare occasions the club grants life time memberships to people who made exceptional contributions to the club.

Danny was born in Santa Barbara on September 16, 1942. His family moved to Atascadero when he was in high school He was a gifted student and athlete. He played football for Atascadero High School and Santa Barbara City College. While studying to be an architect, Danny answered the call of the "family business," *RAILROADING*. Danny's father, Charlie, and his brother, Big Bob, also had long ca-

reers at the Southern and Union Pacific Railroads. In his 20's joined by younger brother, Teri, the Nagle brothers played semi pro football with the Santa Maria Hawks. The doctors who treated Danny during his eight year battle with Alzheimer's theorized a football injury may have contributed to the onset of that horrible disease.

Danny learned to ski at Badger Pass. He loved the sport and was good at it. During the winter months, work on the railroad was slow. That didn't bother Danny one bit. He purchased a USSA Gold Pass which gave him unlimited ski days at most of the US Ski Resorts. Danny loaded up his Bronco and was off to ski for weeks at a time. As a member of Far West Ski Association he heard there was a ski club in San Luis Obispo. He joined in 1982. From then on he was a quiet contributor to most club events. In 1984 he purchased a new ski boat. That started his association with club water ski trips. During those times Danny would get out on the water at 8 am. On a busy weekend at the lake he would pull anyone who wanted to ski. He was a great boat driver who enjoyed seeing people have fun. He could be quite a prankster. If anyone got too cocky behind the boat, he would turn into the skier and dump them in the water.

After marrying Lauren in 1985 the bachelor had to settle down a bit and curtail his weeks long ski safaris. He simply turned his competitive nature to ski racing. He loved the challenge. He became the SLO Skiers Race Director for several years. Under his direction the club competed in regional, state wide, and national ski races. Among the teams many victories was winning the Central Council Challenge Cup, numerous times. The Club also won the prestigious Joe Ross Memorial Cup racing against hundreds of competitors at the FWSA Ski week. He tirelessly gave of his time and money to support the club team.

The next challenge he accepted was the Presidency of Central Racing League. At this level Danny worked with clubs from Bakersfield, Visalia, Fresno, Salinas, Santa Barbara and SLO. Most race weekends Central League had more than 100 racers on course. During his leadership the Council race team won the SICO (San Diego, Inland, Central and Orange Council) championship several years in a row. While the teams racer's were honing their skills on the slopes, Danny patiently stood at the top of the course, encouraging and starting racers down the course. After the race everyone took off to free ski. That was everyone but Danny. He headed to the condo and his computer to calculate race results.

The third sport Danny enjoyed was bicycling. His strong legs and heart made him an accomplished rider. He was never the fastest, but he always finished the ride.

In the 1990's Dan retired from the club. While still working, he enjoyed a quieter lifestyle. Always of great importance to him were his four legged kids. Many of us remember Lucky dog. Then there was his little buddy, Yoda. Danny was a quiet man with a very soft heart. Next time you whiz down a slope or take a ski run at the lake, remember Danny's contributions to our fun.



There will be a celebration of Danny's life on
Thursday, February 11th from 4:00pm to 7:00pm
at our residence; 1667 Partridge Drive, San Luis Obispo.
The entree is being catered. If you can attend, I'm asking special friends to bring either a salad or dessert. Those who knew Danny well knew he LOVED chocolate chip cookies (hint, hint).


