Telluride Ski Week

So many choices, so little time. As you make your ski decisions for the 2016 ski season, SLO Skiers has not two, but three, weeklong options for your skiing pleasure. Telluride kicks off the weeklong season, taking place January 30-February 6. Also in February is our every other year Tahoe ski trip. We'll be at south shore again for this trip. The final trip, which takes place mid March is to Park City, Utah. You will see lots of



information on this trip in the newsletter as well.

I do have some new information for you regarding the Telluride trip. I was able to do two things that may be helpful in your decision making. First, I was able to negotiate an extension to sign up deadline. You now have until September 15 to make your decision and send in your first deposit. Be sure to check the deposit schedule carefully and mark your calendar reminders so your deposits get handled on time.

Secondly, I was able to secure some lodging that is a bit less expensive. The Mountainside Inn is in town, less than a block from a chairlift and the gondola. It is a couple of blocks from the Riverside Condos (our other lodging option). It is hotel lodging with a king bed and a twin bed in the room. There is also a kitchenette with a 2 burner stove, microwave, mini fridge, coffee pot, etc. Two people could easily cook meals and eat in if they so chose. The cost of this lodging is \$1060, almost \$300 less than Riverside Condos. In addition to price point, the other advantage to the Mountainside Inn is bedding configuration. The Riverside Condos all have a king or queen bed in the master and 2 beds in the second bedroom. That translates to a couple and 2 singles in each condo, OR 2 females sharing a king size bed. Currently, we are very short on couples to make the lodging work.
