Vail Pass, what is the deal?

The SLO Skiers are able to offer you a great deal!! We waited until the Breckenridge and South Lake Tahoe trips were put together to offer you the following:

The lift tickets for Breckenridge (at group rates) are \$405. Three tickets at Heavenly, Kirkwood, and Northstar at group rates will cost you \$219. The Epic Local Pass is \$529. This allows you unlimited, unrestricted skiing or riding at Breckenridge, Keystone, Afton Alps, Mt. Brighton and Arapahoe Basin, 10 days at Vail and Beaver Creek with holiday restrictions. There are blackout dates when the pass can't be used. They are Vail, Beaver Creek, Heavenly, Northstar & Kirkwood restricted dates are; 11/29-11/30/2013, 12/26-12/31/2013, 1/1/8/2014, 2/15-2/16/2014. However as a pass holder you can purchase a ticket during the blackout dates for \$52 (also a big savings) at Heavenly, Northstar, and Kirkwood. Because of the special deal this pass won't have Ski-With-AFriend options on these passes. Therefore if you want to save money you need to buy this pass.

There is also an Epic Pass for \$689 that includes unrestricted access to Canyons in Utah, 5 days at Verbier, Switzerland and 5 free consecutive days at Arlberg, Austria. If you are going to ski at the Canyons or the mentioned European resorts this is the pass for you.

As with all special deals there is fine print. Your job is to go to the www.snow.com. Click on the passes in the orange bar for all the specifics. If you plan on skiing 6 days at Heavenly, Kirkwood or Northstar, or at Ski Week the pass is a no brainer purchase.

There are two more passes available You need to pay the \$529. NON REFUNDABLE, NON TRANSFERABLE price at the September meeting. If you can't attend the meeting email Lauren at mlnskier@gmail.com to sign up. I highly recommend you buy insurance for \$20 for the pass. Consult the above referenced website for those details.

This is yet another reason to belong to the SLO Skiers. If you have already purchased your pass details of when you can pick them up will be available at the September meeting. Skiing is an expensive sport. Take advantage of this deal. By the way, 4 of the sold passes are for *Mammoth* Pass holders.

BRECKENRIDGE UPDATE:

For those of us who purchased the Vail Local's Pass: You should be receiving your pass in the next couple of weeks. When the pass was purchased your email and snail mail address was provided to Vail Associates. Therefore keep a close eye on the mail box. If you haven't had a Vail Pass in the past, you simply take your paperwork to the ticket counter of any of the Vail owned resorts. They take your picture and you are on the slopes! In review your Vail Local's Pass is good at Heavenly, Kirkwood, and NorthStar in the Tahoe area. There are some black out dates, mostly holiday and 3 day weekends. In the Summit County of Colorado your pass is good at Breckenridge, Arapaho Basin, Keystone, Vail and Beaver Creek.

The good news is that Breckenridge already has snow and five lifts are open. The bad news is that the trip is sold out. If you want to go, contact Lauren at mlnskier@gmail.com. You can pay the deposit that is due to get on the waiting list. If a spot becomes available, we cash your check. If there aren't any cancellations we give your check back.

Mark your calendar; the pre-trip party will be March 7th at 6 PM.





Sochi Olympics: Going for the Gold, Spending in the Red

The Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia likely will take the gold for being the most expensive Games in history. Originally estimated at some \$12 billion, the final costs for hosting the Sochi games is expected to exceed \$50 billion—far surpassing the high of \$15 billion in Athens in 2004. That money, equal to the annual GDP of Burma, is unlikely to be recovered.

American Ski Pioneer, Charles Moon, founder of the Wolf Creek Ski Area, turned 100 recently and spent the day, how else, but skiing. Members of the Gray Wolves Ski Club and fellow ski enthusiasts showed up at Wolf Creek Ski Area in Colorado to help celebrate Charles' birthday. He had over 150 fellow skiers cheering him on. Charles is credited as one of the pioneers of skiing in the San Juan Mountains. He has skied every year since 1934, except for the five years when he served in the Air Force during World War II.

Women's Ski Jumping... An Olympic Sport for the First Time

Women's Ski Jumping Team and the New York

<u>Times:</u> The VISA Women's Ski Jumping USA team made the cover of the New York Times Magazine on November 24th. The cover story, entitled ""Who Said Girls Can't Jump", takes an in-depth look at the decade-long struggle to get a women's ski jumping event into the Olympic Winter Games by focusing on the U.S. team's fight to get there and to win. In conjunction with the New York Times Magazine cover story, Women's Ski Jumping USA has launched a new fundraising campaign to raise \$70,000 to meet budget demands of their most expensive World Cup season ever.

LET'S PUT OUR USA WOMEN'S SKI JUMPERS ON THE PODI- UM IN SOCH!! You know their story; they struggled against overwhelming odds to compete in the 2010 Olympics. Even with favorable Canadian laws, they were not allowed to compete. Now, with four years' training and jumping in international competition, they are going to carry OUR flag and the hopes of all Far West Members to Sochi in the first Winter Olympics ever to feature women's ski jumping.

The Far West Ski Foundation and the Far West Ski Association made a joint commitment earlier this month to raise a share of the \$70,000 stated by WSJUSA as needed to cover our team's last minute expenses and we need help from any and all members. Our joint Far West share is \$5000 by February 5. The current USA Women's Ski Jumping team lives and trains in Park City. It's like they are Far West's team!

We are asking individuals to consider making a taxdeductible contribution to Far West Ski Foundation in this tax year (or in January for that matter). Councils and clubs can make their contributions, earmarked for our jumpers, any time before early February. The Foundation is the lead for this campaign, with the Association in a strong backstop role to top off the joint commitment.

Our season opener will be where there is the best snow in the Eastern Sierra. If you haven't experi-

About Mammoth...

The mountain is unbelievable. No matter how long you have skied there it is always exciting! The top of the mountain is at 11,053 feet. It is the highest summit of any California resort. There are 3,500 skiable acres. The snowboarding is some of the best anywhere. There is over 3,100 vertical feet, and over 150 named trails and 28 lifts! The terrain is 15% expert, 20% advanced, 40% intermediate and 25% beginner. The ski school is one of THE BEST anywhere. If you are just learning or perhaps revisiting the sport after a long absence you need to check out the ski school. For one thing, it will help you get your bearings in this MAMMOTH area. Check out the website; mammothmountain.com. Be sure and ask who has a Pass and can get your discounted lift tickets.

to Avoid Ski Injuries Later

Before heading out on a ski vacation, most people prepare by reserving a room, booking a flight, packing their winter clothes and, of course, their skis. However, if they do not prepare their body, they might end up spending more time in the doctor's office than on the slopes. Of the nearly 144,000 skiing injuries reported per year, anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) tears, such as that suffered by ski racer Lindsey Vonn, are the most common, followed by ulnar collateral ligament (UCL) tears, or skier's thumb.

PHILANTHROPY REPORT FOR JANUARY 2014

Congratulations to all on a job well done. We truly have a generous group of members. Our total charity giving so far, since I assumed the Club's philanthropy role, is as follows:

- 127 pounds of food to the Food Bank
- \$20 to the Food Bank
- 271 pounds of diapers and baby wipes to the Food Bank
- 93 pounds of hotel toiletries to the Homeless Shelter

Two members assisted disabled veterans learn to surf in the AmpSurf clinic at Pismo Beach.

Fourteen (14) members supported the Central Coast Follies, a charity donation for Parkinson's research. At \$29 per member, our total contribution was \$406.

We started a new function in the Club, that of "Sunshine" person who sends get-well cards, sympathy cards, etc. to any members needing support after accident, illness, surgery, etc.

We started the memorial tree program for any deceased club members, not only for their recognition but also to show support for their family members.

Any donor can go to any Rabobank and donate to this particular relief fund and know that 100% of their donation will go to direct aid to these villagers. Thank you very much from the bottom of my heart.
