APRIL 2014 PHILANTHROPY REPORT :

ANNUAL SUMMARY:

Ours is a club of truly generous members. Since I assumed the office of Philanthropy Chair in April 2013, our club's total charity giving has been as follows:

- 127 pounds of food, \$20 cash, and 271 pounds of diapers and baby wipes were donated to the San Luis Obispo Food Bank.
- 124.5 pounds of hotel sample toiletries were given to the San Luis Obispo Homeless Shelter.
- Members assisted disabled veterans (mostly amputees) learn to surf in the AmpSurf clinic at Pismo Beach. The Club has decided to support AmpSurf on a continuing basis in teaching amputee veterans to surf. Upcoming clinics will be held on May 3rd June 14th and September 4th–8th
- We "adopted" the village of Dumarao in the Philippines after the devastating super typhoon Haiyan destroyed the village in November 2013. One of our members raised \$9,000 to help this Philippine village of 1,300 people recover. We collected \$590 in donations for the relief effort from our Club members alone; and with recovery taking several years, we expect to continue supporting this village. Through our donations we have already provided them basic food of rice and sardines and have financially helped in the building of their small chapel and pre-school.
- Members donated sweat shirts, sweat pants and books to the Elks Lodge for hospitalized veterans. Members also contributed "toys for tots" via the Elks Lodge. Members anonymously provided gifts to needy families through the "angels program" at the Elks Lodge.
- Fourteen (14) members supported the Central Coast Follies, a charity donation for Parkinson's research. Our total contribution was \$406. In total, the Follies contributed \$23,000 to Parkinson's research.
- We started a new function in the Club, that of "Sunshine" person who sends get-well cards, sympathy cards, etc. to any members needing support after accident, illness, surgery, etc.
- We started the memorial tree program for any deceased Club members, not only for their recognition but also to show support for their family members. Two recently deceased members will have their trees planted soon.
- We collected and donated \$824 to help pay some medical bills of a fellow member who sustained a tragic accident in Mexico.

AMPSURF IS COMING UP SOON!!!

The SLO Skiers Board is encouraging members to participate in the upcoming AmpSurf surfing events at Pismo Beach May 3rd, June 14th, and September 4th-8th as one of our community service projects. These are events when disabled veterans (mostly amputees) are assisted to learn to surf, regardless of whether they sit, lie down on their bellies, or stand. It is by far one of the most personally rewarding experiences you will ever have, whether you assist deep in the water, near the shore, or on the beach. The joy of accomplishment in the veterans' faces will make these events something you will want to participate in over and over. Wet suits and booties are provided, and lunch is served for all veterans and volunteers. Also bring a waterproof camera to the surfing event if you have one. There are two requirements of participating in the May 3rd online to http://ampsurf.org/clinics/volunteer/ and complete and submit their volunteer application form early, and 2) attend a volunteer meeting on 4/29 at 5:30 pm at 340 Pomeroy St. in Pismo Beach.
