BICYCLING – HIKING – CAMPING TOUR OF EXOTIC ANIMALS AND FOSSIL HILLS AT CAMATTA RANCH



Camatta Ranch is a real working cattle and exotic animal ranch of 32,000 acres, in existence since Spanish Land Grant days. Our trip will include wildflower viewing (maybe), wildlife a tour of the fossil hills and exotic animals, followed by a leisurely picnic under the towering oaks and the opportunity to hike and bicycle(bicycling thru the hills on the cow trails is the MOST fun!) with NO traffic!

Tour of exotic animal zoo and 5-7 million year old fossil hills on Saturday (no collecting.)

Come for just the day trip on Saturday, or for a weekend of activities as follows:

RVers and campers will dine under the stars and enjoy the usual SLO skiers dinner bringing something to barbecue and a side dish. Then join in an outrageous campfire and camp overnight in this most fabulous pristine environment. (We will be the only outsiders on the ranch and have full use of the trails and roads)

Bring: MOUNTAIN Bicycles, Walking shoes, binoculars, jacket, camera, picnic lunch.

Tables and a FLUSH TOILET are located at the site – otherwise this is primitive camping so bring everything you need, including trash bags – carry out. Please bring firewood.

Overnighters – bring a potluck dish and something to barbecue in addition to all of the above and provisions for Sunday – depending upon how long you plan to stay.




