Message from the President

Annual Club Financial Report. Good news. Although much of what we do as a club is deliberately informal, your board of directors and officers take their financial responsibilities very seriously. The Club is organized as a California non-profit corporation and is also a licensed Seller of Travel with the Attorney General of California. As such we maintain two separate fund accounts: 1) a travel trust account to manage trip funds and 2) a second fund account for general business purposes. Both accounts are in order and in the black.

The travel trust account is used for accumulation of trip deposits and payments. When you consider the number of participants and individual trip payments for the many trips throughout the year, this account processes a large amount of money. As such, these funds must be kept separate from other club funds. This account is also used to make initial, required deposits to hold spaces on airlines and condos.

The second bank account is for general club purposes; and the board of directors and officers continually review account transactions to ensure accuracy and sufficiency. At the start of the new membership year (September), this account stood at \$52,117.42 and represents the Club's equity. Under current Club policy, \$10,000 is advanced to the travel trust account to finance trip deposits and advance payments made to obtain favorable terms from travel service providers. No less than another \$5,000 is held to cover estimated annual operating expenses. An additional \$25,000 is always maintained as an operating reserve (rainy day reserve of 25% estimated annual trip costs) supporting our travel trust account. At future Board meetings, the directors and officers will discuss this new financial year's budget and how to use the general business account to best support Club social activities and other projects.

China Peak is in the Air

Ski season is just a few weeks away, with Mammoth Mountain opening Veteran's Day weekend, and most other ski areas opening the weekend after Thanksgiving. With the sophisticated snow making equipment being used at most ski areas in California, you will have many options in your ski planning.

SLO Skiers will have two weekend trips to China Peak this year. The first trip will be Friday, January 24th to Sunday, January 26th. I am still looking for a trip captain for this trip. The trip captain is responsible for assisting in selling the trip, helping with carpools, etc., AND assuming responsibilities for running the trip once the group arrives at China Peak. The trip director will take care of booking the trip, arranging the lodging, lift tickets, etc.

The second China Peak trip is scheduled for Friday March 14th to Sunday, March 16th. Bobbi Binder has volunteered to be the trip captain for this trip.

China Peak has a unique program this year for those who would like to ski mid-week. Stays booked at the China Peak Inn for Sunday through Thursday nights will include 2 free lift tickets to be used the following day of the stay. This means a room booked for Sunday night has 2 free tickets for skiing on Monday, and so forth.

For those who would like a longer stay, or those who would like to ski just mid-week at China Peak, we can add onto either or both of these trips. Colorado Slopes Open: Arapahoe Basin has started turning its chairs for the public. On Sunday, October 13th, A-Basin fired up the engines on one of their main chairs to let guests make their first turns of the season. This was four days earlier than they have ever opened. When you get the chance, take it!

Ski Magazine Names #1 Resort: Ski Magazine has named **Jackson Hole Mountain Resort** as the leading resort in North America. Ranked number one in SKI Magazine's annual poll of North American ski areas, it is the first time that Jackson Hole has made it to the top of the list. Congratulations, JHMR.

Effects of Government Shutdown: Arizona Snow Bowl and Aspen/Snowmass got the better of the feds when they chose to spin their lifts in spite of parks being shut down. At Aspen, management ran its Silver Queen gondola for free on October 12-13 to allow Aspen tourists, hoping to get to the Maroon Bells, an opportunity to enjoy fall foliage on the mountain, while Arizona Snow Bowl extended it's scenic chair lift operation through those same dates. Tourists in both locations were afforded beautiful autumn views all the way around.

Our season opener will be where there is the best snow in the Eastern Sierra. If you haven't experi-

ence skiing at MAMMOTH this is your chance! No other mountain compares to this ski resort which is aptly named. Here are a few things you need to know; It is approximately a 7 hour drive. Check with Lauren for the "shortcuts". Mammoth is located off of US 395. 395 is infamous for the LA Crazies and their disregard of the speed limits. The drive is long, but not the curvy mountains roads you may have experienced going to other ski areas. Once you get to your lodging property you can park your car and probably wont need it, because the town of Mammoth has a great shuttle system. Be sure to pick up the bus schedule when you check in. The mountain is about 5 miles from the downtown central area. The bus system has a great schedule that runs on time.



About Mammoth...

The mountain is unbelievable. No matter how long you have skied there it is always exciting! The top of the mountain is at 11,053 feet. It is the highest summit of any California resort. There are 3,500 skiable acres. The snowboarding is some of the best anywhere. There is over 3,100 vertical feet, and over 150 named trails and 28 lifts! The terrain is 15% expert, 20% advanced, 40% intermediate and 25% beginner. The ski school is one of THE BEST anywhere. If you are just learning or perhaps revisiting the sport after a long absence you need to check out the ski school. For one thing, it will help you get your bearings in this MAMMOTH area. Check out the website; mammothmountain.com. Be sure and ask who has a Pass and can get your discounted lift tickets.



Where to stay...
