Taos Ski Valley February, 6-13 ~ Update ~

Hello Fellow Taos-ers, Here is an update for the Taos trip.

First & foremost, **Taos is OPEN!** They opened Dec 11 and have been getting **SNOW!!!** The **Snow Report** shows 18 inches of snow in the last 7 days. **Base Depth:** Mid Mountain, 35 inches, Top of the Mountain, 43 inches. That's pretty good for mid-December, especially with the season off to a slow start almost everywhere else. Some travelers opted out before Dec 1st, but we still have 41 members going.

December 2020 Philanthropy Report

The end of the year is coming soon, and because many fund raising events have been canceled during 2020, our local community organizations need us more than ever! Due to COVID, the need to help others with food insecurity is stronger than ever.

You have all seen on the news the long lines of people waiting for food. This is not only happening around the country, but here in our county too! The SLO Food Bank has 80 distributions each month at 64 locations in San Luis Obispo County.

Each year at our Club's holiday party we asked each of you to bring a food item or donate cash to the SLO Food Bank. Last year we donated 150 food items and \$270 in cash.

With this year's party canceled, <u>we are asking every Club member to donate directly to the</u> <u>SLO Food Bank</u>. If every active member donated \$10 we could potentially be donating over \$1500 to the SLO Food Bank. Plus, each cash donation is multiplied many times by the Food Bank's ability to purchase food at huge discounts – each dollar you give is actually giving much more! As an example, a \$25 donation will provide 175 Holiday meals!

We are asking you to mail (or drop off) your cash donation to the SLO Food Bank, and on the check's note line, write 'SLO Skiers Club'. You can also request a receipt for tax purposes. You can also donate on their web site.

Due to COVID and staffing, they are not taking food donations at this time. If you prefer to give food items (cans or packaged food), please deliver the items to: CAPSLO Homeless Shelter, 40 Prado Road, SLO or Loaves & Fishes, 2650 26th Street, Paso Robles





To reach a peak, to no avail.


Pete's A-Fib attack,




<u>HAPPY BIRTHDAY!</u> Happy 101st birthday to ski legend, and Aspen local - *Klaus Obermeyer*! Klaus still attends the SIA Show each year, and skis his run, "*Klaus' Way*" on Buttermilk Mountain. He has inspired many by his positivity, innovation in skiing and athleticism.

<u>A BIG WIN FOR MIKAELA</u>: On December 14th, a beautiful day in Courchevel, France, Mikaela Shiffrin made her triumphant and emotional return to the top step on the podium in a FIS World Cup. Heavy snow fell on Saturday, and then Sunday's scheduled giant slalom was postponed, leaving a hard and fast track for the women on Monday under blazing sunlight. However, it was worth the wait to see Mikaela take her first World Cup win in almost a year. It was a beautiful moment when she crossed the finish line ahead of the field, taking her first win after her father's sudden passing earlier this year. Emotions ran even higher when she stepped off the podium and into her mom's arms, as she cried through her post-race interview. Congratulations, Mikaela, and to AJ Hurt, who took home her first World Cup giant slalom points, and top-20, in 18th place.

SNOW SPORTS MUSEUM: Tahoe-Truckee Skiers Nominated to the 2020-21 U.S. Ski & Snowboard Teams include: Squaw Valley skiers - Bryce Bennett and Travis Ganong, both nominated to the men's Alpine "A" team, while Squaw Valley's Keely Cashman, joins the women's "B" team and Squaw Valley's AJ Hurt competes on the women's "C" team. Sugar Bowl's Ainsley Proffit, a Missouri native, and Squaw Valley's Alix Wilkinson, who hails from Mammoth Lakes, CA, will be training and competing on the Alpine Development Team. DID YOU KNOW -- Tamara McKinney, a member of the SNOW Sports Museum Advisory Board, was the first U.S. woman skier to win the World Cup Overall Championship. In addition to that landmark triumph in 1983, McKinney won 18 World Cup races during her stellar career.

LAS VEGAS HAS MORE THAN GAMING: The Las Vegas ski area's Lee Canyon has been given the green light by the U.S. Forest Service to move forward with expansion plans to add two new lifts, 23 ski runs, mountain bike trails, a mountain coaster, additional parking, a zipline, and other amenities. Located only an hour north of Las Vegas, this expansion is highly anticipated as Las Vegas's area of interest in outdoor recreation has increased. Las Vegas tourism has always been centered around gaming and luxury, but this expansion appeals to a new market in Southern Nevada tourism. While Lee Canyon has occupied its 785-acre area since 1964, this expansion will allow them to accommodate the growing interest in Winter activities and the growing population in Clark County.

FAR WEST CONVENTION – 6 MONTHS! AND COUNTING: The San Diego Council of Ski Clubs has been busy making plans for the 88th Annual Far West Convention. The dates are set for June 10-13, 2021, at the San Diego Marriott Mission Valley. There will be some interesting Educational Seminars, and we are currently seeking Public Affairs speakers and a Keynote speaker. One of our favorite events, the Golf tournament, which is now the 13th Annual Michael German Memorial, will be at the Riverwalk Golf Club, on Friday, June 11th. Barbara Blasé is set to head this event up, with assistance from Mike and Eileen Sanford, and a few other North Islanders. Michael was a long-time Board member of Far West, and a past recipient of the J. Stanley Mullen award in 2004. Michael left us in 2006.
